Scholarships

Admission Requirements

In order to be eligible for admission, you must have a minimum UC/CSU GPA of 2.0. This GPA is calculated based on grades earned in the 10th-12th grade A-G pattern courses only. A-G courses are:

- 4 years English
- 3 years Math (Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry)
- 2 years same Foreign Language
- 2 years of lab science (1 physical, 1 biological)
- 2 years History/Social Science
- 1 year Visual and Performing Arts
- 1 year college Prep elective

A-G requirements must be completed with a C or better in each course.

Eligible students must also submit either their SAT I or ACT scores. The minimum Eligibility Index required is a 2900 using the SAT I or 694 using the ACT.

(High School GPA x 800) + SAT I = Eligibility Index

(High School GPA x 200) + (10 x ACT composite score) = Eligibility Index

Fall transcripts showing work in progress should be submitted with the application.
